A.I.F., called a conference of prospective C.O.'s together with his B.M. Maj. C.B. Dawkins, Austn. Staff Corps, to select Regtl. Officers for units of his A.I.F. Bde. viz: -2/18, 2/19, and 2/20 Bns. Lt.-Col. W.D. Jeater, C.O. 2 Bn. A.M.F., Newcastle, N.S.W., and Acting B.M. 1 Inf. Bde., A.M.F., selected to comd. 2/20 Bn., attended this meeting at which Brig. Taylor outlined his views regarding selection of officers and his policy generally. This meeting was enlarged during the course of the morning to include prospective Bn. 2 i/c's and additional members of the new Bde. Staff; Maj. G.E. Ramsey, E.D., B.M. 9 Inf. Bde. A.M.F., attending as prospective 2 i/c 2/20 Bn. A.A.Q.M.G. 8 Div., Col. H.R. Broadbent, Austn. Staff Corps, was also present and a number of officers were discussed and several tentatively selected. <i>G.E.R.</i>
