

On Friday 29<sup>th</sup> April 2022, Stewart Thompson, Wendy and I attended the funeral of John Love. A member of our association who passed away on the 18<sup>th</sup> April 2022. The service was held at Northern Suburbs Memorial Gardens and Crematorium and the service was well attended; I spoke briefly about John.

Wendy and I attended the VP Day Commemoration service at the Cenotaph Martin Place Sydney on the 15<sup>th</sup> August 2022.

Later in August Wendy and I were on a road trip in which we visited a number of places heading up the NSW North Coast and into QLD, on the trip we drove into Murwillumbah to locate the Sandakan Memorial Walkway, which is in a park (Remembrance Place) outside the Tweed Shire Council Offices. The walkway contains plaques and information boards which provide excellent information on the Death Marches. Two of our 2/20<sup>th</sup> Battalion Servicemen are commemorated here, Private Donald Haigh Lee NX46082 of B Force and Private Victor Robert Raison of F Force. The formerly Hostel 2 will be known as Richardson House, after Bart Richardson, who had been a resident there for more than 20 years. In 2011 Bart was elected the prestigious "Eminent Resident" in recognition of his contribution to residents. I spoke at this renaming ceremony on behalf of Bart's Family and our Association.

Private Jack Sidney Orr NX53745 of B Force.

On Friday 18<sup>th</sup> November 2022, Wendy and I attended The Last Post Ceremony held at the Australian War Memorial Canberra. This ceremony honoured Private Jack Sidney Orr NX53745 who had transferred to the 2/20<sup>th</sup> Battalion during captivity and was on B Force nominal roll. Private Orr died stealing food on the 27<sup>th</sup> March 1945. His story is mentioned on Page 333 of Singapore and Beyond which details the circumstances of his death. I laid a wreath at this ceremony. At the conclusion of the ceremony I spoke to a fellow who was standing beside me and who had also laid a wreath.

I asked if he was a family member, he replied no, I am U.S. Army and the person beside is U.S. Navy. We are here today as a group visiting the Australian War Memorial. I said to him my father was a POW in Japan when the two atomic bombs were dropped ending the war in the Pacific. I said I am grateful to the U.S. for ending the war which allowed the prisoners to be released. The young U.S. Army man looked at me and said "No we are indebted to you sir; Australia is a great ally of the U.S." and we shook hands.

The 81<sup>st</sup> Anniversary of the Fall of Singapore was on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> February 2023, Stewart Thompson and James Thompson attended The Last Post Ceremony on this day which was held at the Australian War Memorial. This ceremony honoured Gunner John Francis Godfrey Alford NX45906 who died on the 23<sup>rd</sup> January 1942, 2/15<sup>th</sup> Field Regiment, which was part of the 8<sup>th</sup> Division.



## Item of Interest

The Australian Memorial Walk honours those who have served and supported the Defence of Australia in peace and in war. The paved pathway links five monuments erected to remember the major conflict periods in Australia's history, Colonial, World War 1, World War 2, Post World War 2 and Peace Keeping.


The Memorial Walk is located on North Fort Road Manly NSW. The entrance to the walk is about 100 metres east from the carpark. It is marked by a sandstone plinth (the photo). Follow the path for 100 metres and you will come to the beginning of the pavers marked by dual sandstone plinths. Individuals can donate an inscribed paver to the walkway, cost \$70.00. ## **ANZAC DAY LUNCH 2023**

You would have all received an e-mail explaining the issues we face with our Annual Anzac Day Meeting and Luncheon at the Tattersalls Club.

As advised in the e-mail, the minimum charge for events on Public Holidays is \$7,500. If we have 66 guests this year (as per last year), the cost per head would be \$113.64.

To date (14<sup>th</sup> March), responses received suggest that so far, we have 64 attendees (possibly 66). Based on confirmed numbers (64), the cost per person (based on the minimum charge of the Tattersalls Club) is \$117.18. The cost charged to members will be \$90 and the Association will pay the difference to make up the minimum charge of \$7,500 (\$1,740). The optimum result would be getting 70 attendees which would mean that the Association will only be "out of pocket" \$1,400. The maximum capacity of the Tattersall's Club room is 75.

We will include our future Anzac Day lunches as an item in the Annual General Meeting Agenda this year, so please have a think and come this year armed with suggestions.
